## REQUIRED SAFETY EQUIPMENT

### Class 3C Fishing Vessels – 60 metres or longer

Seagoing Fishing Vessel, 60 metres or longer, for use in all operational areas up to and including Restricted offshore operations. *(Restricted offshore operations: operations within a limit of 50 nautical miles seaward from designated smooth or partially smooth waters, designated restricted offshore waters or a safe haven)*

 <p><b>Liferafts and rescue boats</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Inflatable Coastal Liferaft(s) for 100% of allowable crew and any other persons on board plus a non-SOLAS Rescue Boat.                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Vessels continuously engaged on voyages in operational areas with a monthly mean temperature of 15° C or less must carry an anti-exposure suit for each person assigned to crew the Rescue Boat.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

## REQUIRED SAFETY EQUIPMENT

### Class 3C Fishing Vessels – Between 45 metres and less than 60 metres in length

Seagoing Fishing Vessel, from 45 metres and less than 60 metres in length, for use in all operational areas up to and including Restricted offshore operations. (*Restricted offshore operations: operations within a limit of 50 nautical miles seaward from designated smooth, partially smooth or restricted offshore waters or a safe haven*)

 <p><b>Liferafts and rescue boats</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Inflatable Coastal Liferaft(s) for 100% of allowable crew and any other persons on board <u>plus</u> a non-SOLAS Rescue Boat.                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Vessels continuously engaged on voyages in operational areas with a monthly mean temperature of 15° C or less must carry an anti-exposure suit for each person assigned to crew the Rescue Boat.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
 <p><b>Lifebuoys</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>6 x Lifebuoys: 1 with a light; 2 with lights and smoke signal; 2 with buoyant lines; 1 of operator's choice.</li> </ul>

Seagoing Fishing Vessel, from 25 metres and less than 45 metres in length, for use in all operational areas up to and including Restricted offshore operations. (*Restricted offshore operations: operations within a limit of 50 nautical miles seaward from designated smooth or partially smooth waters, designated restricted offshore waters or a safe haven*)

 <p><b>Liferafts and rescue boats</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Inflatable Coastal Liferaft(s) for 100% of allowable crew and any other persons on board <u>plus</u> a non-SOLAS Rescue Boat.                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Vessels continuously engaged on voyages in operational areas with a monthly mean temperature of 15° C or less must carry an anti-exposure suit for each person assigned to crew the Rescue Boat.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Seagoing Fishing Vessel, from 15 metres and less than 25 metres in length, for use in all operational areas up to and including Restricted offshore operations. *(Restricted offshore operations: operations within a limit of 50 nautical miles seaward from designated smooth or partially smooth waters, designated restricted offshore waters or a safe haven)*

 <b>Liferafts</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Inflatable Coastal Liferaft(s) for 100% of allowable crew and any other persons on board.</li> </ul>
 <b>Lifebuoys</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2 x lifebuoys: 1 with a light; 1 with a buoyant line.</li> </ul>
 <b>Life jackets</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Coastal Life Jacket with light for 100% of allowable crew and any other persons on board.</li> </ul>
 <b>Distress signals</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1 x 406MHz Electronic Position Indicating Radio Beacon.</li> <li>3 x Parachute distress rockets.</li> <li>2 x Red hand-held flares.</li> <li>1 x Orange hand-held smoke flares.</li> </ul>

### Class 3C Fishing Vessels – Less than 15 metres in length

Seagoing Fishing Vessel, less than 15 metres in length, for use in all operational areas up to and including Restricted offshore operations. (*Restricted offshore operations: operations within a limit of 50 nautical miles seaward from designated smooth or partially smooth waters, designated restricted offshore waters or a safe haven*)

 <p><b>Liferafts</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Inflatable Coastal Liferaft(s) for 100% of allowable crew and any other persons on board.                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– A Liferafts is not required if the vessel is fitted with internal buoyancy in accordance with NSCV Part C section 6.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
 <p><b>Lifebuoys</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1 x Lifebuoy with light.                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– A Lifebuoy is not required if the vessel is less than 10m in length and carries 1 x person only.</li> <li>– A Lifebuoy is not required if the vessel is less than 6 m in length and is fitted with internal buoyancy in accordance with the NSCV Part C, section 6.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
 <p><b>Life jackets</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Coastal Life Jacket with a light for 100% of allowable crew and any other persons on board.</li> </ul>
