Rosslyn Bay Boat Harbour, boat ramps reconfiguration Frequently asked Questions

Q: What is the budget for the upgraded works?

A: The commitment is to upgrade the two public boat ramps in the Rosslyn Bay Boat Harbour with a budget of \$2 million.

Q: When is the public consultation period?

A: Monday 9 August 2021 to Friday 3 September 2021.

Q: What is the current concept for these works?

A: The current concept can be found on MSQ's webpage <u>Current and announced projects</u> (Maritime Safety Queensland) (msq.qld.gov.au)

The initial concept for this upgrade involves increasing the Rosslyn Bay boat ramp capacity by adding three extra lanes to the two ramps, which will provide 11 lanes in total (current capacity is eight lanes) and increasing the length of the westernmost floating walkway by up to 60 metres.

The eastern boat ramp floating walkway will be able to be used on both sides once the two new lanes have been built adjacent to it

The extra lanes and extension to the western floating walkway will greatly relieve waiting times and on-water congestion for boaties using the two boat ramps.
