

**"Smooth waters"** (as described in Schedule 9) means the waters-  
• of rivers, creeks, streams and lakes; or  
• within breakwaters or revetments; or  
• described in Schedule 7 that are within 0.5 nautical mile from land; or  
• described in Schedule 8.  
**"Partially smooth waters"** means the waters-  
• described in Schedule 7, other than waters within 0.5 nautical mile from land.

-  The EPIRB 2 nautical mile limit may not be shown for every island due to scale but still applies to any land above highest water mark.
