Detention Notice

Transport Infrastructure (Public Marine Facilities) Regulation 2023

This Detention Notice is issued under Division 1 ‘Contravening property’ Section 44 of the *Transport Infrastructure (Public Marine Facilities) Regulation 2023* (the Regulation)

Date of this notice: 19 December 2024

Abandoned Property: This Detention Notice relates to property which is reasonably believed to have been abandoned in a State managed boat harbour namely Scarborough Boat Harbour.

Description of Property: 30ft White Yacht – Registration Unknown

Location of Property: The property subject of this Detention Notice has been located, and is currently on vacant piles adjacent the Redcliffe Marina, Scarborough Boat Harbour, Qld, 4020 on 19 December 2024

Claiming Property: Pursuant to section 48 of the Regulation, if you are the owner of the property subject of this Detention Notice, you are required to (within 28 days of this Detention Notice being given or displayed), provide proof of ownership of the property, or otherwise satisfy Maritime Safety Queensland that you are the owner of the property, and pay expenses reasonably incurred by Maritime Safety Queensland in dealing with the abandoned property.

Property not claimed: If no person claims or recovers the property under section 48 of the Regulation, the property may be sold or disposed of. Where property is disposed of, compensation may not be recovered against the State in relation to the disposal of the abandoned property.
